

American Blue Cattle

BREED: American Blue Cattle COLOR: White, blue roan, or black. ANCESTRY: The American Blue began as the Belgian Blue, which originated in central and upper Belgium when the local red-pied and black-pied cattle were crossed with Durham Shorthorn in the late 1800s. Some Charolais influence during the 19th century is also suggested.

HISTORY: Originally a dual purpose breed, beef production became the focus following World War II, when Europe's economy demanded increased beef quality and quantity. During the 1950s, the Belgian cattle underwent a selective genetic breeding and development program conducted by Professor Hanset at the AI Center in the Province of Liege. This program created their unusually heavy muscling.

The first Belgian Blues were imported to the United States in 1978. Today, American Blue Cattle are their own fullblood registered breed, independent from their Belgian relatives after years of

breeding for easier calving, lower birth weights, and improved structural soundness.

BREED CHARACTERISTICS: Large framed cattle with exceptional muscling due to an inactive myostatin gene, and therefore high-yielding carcasses. They are known for quiet temperament, early maturity, short gestation, hardy calves, adaptability, excellent feed conversion, and tender lean meat.

QUALITY AND YIELD: Yield mostly 1s, grade 80% Select due to lack of marbling, but tenderness overrides the lower grade in taste tests.

WEIGHT: Mature fullblood bulls can average up to 2750 lbs., and fullblood mature cows to 1650 lbs. Average birthweight for fullblood Blues is 96.8 lbs. and 79.9 lbs. for a crossbreed.

Feeding the Blues

The Blues are very unique. Feeding and breeding is the most important concept to keep in mind. From a birth of a full blood calf to raising the young stock is very important. The new born calf must have colostrum within the first few hours of life either from the mother or a commercial mix in a bottle.

As the calf is growing up feeding is important. Free choices of a 16% protein feed and good hay is essential. The normal formula is 3% of body weight would be required. When the calf is weaned, maintain the 3% of body weight rule up until the animal is 24 months of age.

Do not breed the full blood heifers until they are 24 months of age. Full blood bulls are not ready for breeding until they are 24 months of age. The full blood animals do not mature until they are 5 years of age. That is why most breeders breed the heifer to a small out cross such as angus for the first two

calves and then the third calf the cow will be 5 years old.

Feeding the mature animals is very important. Feeding silage or grain up until they are 4 months pregnant is alright. After 4 months only hay, grains and minerals are all you can feed the pregnant full blood. With this program you should avoid any calving difficulties unless a breech birth or a twisted leg. Selenium is important to maintain in their diets.

Half breeds and low percentage can be cared for like any other animal.

Knowing your genetics is extremely important in full bloods and high percentage animals. Make sure you use low birth weight bulls at all times. Some of the old genetics produce large calves so one must stay with proven genetics and low birth weight. There is always the possibility of a genetic mix up that could produce a larger calf.

Breeding Up To Fullblood Status

In order to breed up to Fullblood status here are the requirements:

Fullblood bulls are those that are 96% American Blue and above and will be recorded as Fullblood.

Fullblood Females are those that are 93% American Blue and above and will be recorded as Fullblood.

To be recorded as fullblood the grade up animals must be DNA tested to have two copies of the myostatin gene. If the animal has only one copy they remain in the purebred status.

Purebred Bulls are those that are 15/16 or 93.75% up to 96% American Blue.

Purebred Females are those that are 7/8 or 87.5% up to 93% American Blue.

American Blue Cattle - 14

All Fullblood and Purebred cattle must be DNA tested. If the fullbloods are parent verified from birth by DNA testing, they will have an elite status. Those cattle that are bred up to fullblood status must have all generations of the American Blue lineage verified and have a parent verified status. All purebred cattle with parent and previous generations of American Blue testing will have the status of "Parent Verified".

Percentage animals must be registered in order to be shown, but it is up to the breeder if they want to DNA test these animals or opt out of the DNA testing on any percentage animal up to purebred status.

Coat colour inheritance in the Belgian Blue

Regarding coat colour, the Belgian Blue is a "trimorphic breed" with animals belonging to one of the three phenotypes: either completely white or blue or black. The Belgian Blue shares this colour polymorphism with the Shorthorn breed, which is also either completely white or roan or red.

This similarity is not surprising since Shorthorn or Durham breeding animals were imported into Belgium during the second half of the XIXth century.

The study of the inheritance of coat colour in the Shorthorn has attracted two great names of Biometrical Genetics: Karl Pearson on the one hand and Sewall Wright on the other hand.

Pearsons in a paper published with Barrington in 1906, concluded that "it would thus seem that no simple mendelian formula can possibly fit the Shorthorn case" while Sewall Wright, in 1917 and again in 1977, brought strong arguments in favour of the single-gene hypothesis, in spite of few exceptions due to phenotypic overlaps and Herd-Book errors. In 1985, we were able to confirm that the single-gene hypothesis of Sewall Wright was true for the Belgian Blue (Hanset, R 1985, Genet. Sel. Evol. 17(4): 443-458).

Recently, with the unequivocal assignment of the gene for blue to chromosome 5 of the bovine genome, the single gene model was definitely established. (Charlier C. et al 1996 Mammalian Genome 7: 138-142).

To have a colour phenotype similar to that of Galopeur des Hayons which is blue with white spots, several genes must be present: the R gene for blue, The E gene for black and the s gene for white spotting. His genetic formula can be written as follows: RrEEss. The

white areas are due to the homozygosity –ss- for the recessive gene –s- as in the Holstein.

Rr means heterozygosity for the R gene. A single copy of this gene introduces white hairs within the coloured areas. This mixture of white and coloured hairs gives: the roan if the coloured hairs are red (ee for the red phenotype as in the Shorthorn) but the blue if the coloured hairs are black (EE or Ee for the black phenotype as in the Belgian Blue).

On the other hand, two copies of the R gene, as in the homozygote RR, produce the completely white, with the exception of a few black hairs at the tip of the ears and of the tail.

So the bull Opticien d'au Chene is RREE (ss) but the white spotting due to ss is not visible, the bull being entirely white because of RR.

In the Belgian Blue breed, the basic colour is black, most of the animals being homozygous EE. A few are Ee and consequently will give a proportion of red offspring when mated with red (ee) animals or with black animals carrying the red gene (Ee).

Beaujolais de Halledet, father of Opticien, was carrier of the red gene and therefore, he was: RREe(ss) as he was also completely white.

On the other hand, the bull Negre du Home since he is black and white is: rrEEss.

A white Belgian Blue bull crossed with Holstein cows gives blue calves with white spots RREEss x rrEEss = RrEEss.

A blue bull being RrEEss, if crossed with Holstein cows, will produce 50% of blue calves and 50% of black calves, in both cases with white areas.

The Angus is self black because he carries the S gene, S for self-coloured, dominate to s. The Angus is rrEESS. The cross of white bull with Angus cows will give: RREEss x rrEESS =

RrEESs or a completely blue animal with very few white spots if any. Furthermore, it will be hornless since the P for polledness is dominant.

The same cross as above but with red Angus (rreeSS) will give the same result as with the black Angus except if the Belgian Blue bull carries the red factor. In this case, RREess x rreeSS + 50% RrEeSs (blue) and 50% RreeSs (roan).

The Hereford is red with a white face determined by the dominant gene S(H). His genotype is: rreeS(H)S(H). Crossed with a white Belgian Blue, the progeny will be blue with a white face, the genotype being: RrEeS(H)s.

Moreover, a "pattern" gene called "colour-sided" or "white-back" is also found within the bree. This typical pattern is well illustrated with the bull Ephata du Major. The gene responsible S(cs) is dominant.

Therefore, a single copy of the gene is sufficient to produce this pattern. Its presence can easily be traced back along the genelogical tree. So, Ephata got it from his father Parker du Fond de Bois who got it from his grandfather Ardent de la Reche Terre through his mother Nationale due Fond de Bois.

The expression of this gene is quite variable and may be restricted to a black nose and black ears and small-pigmented spots below the eyes.

In the Belgian Blue, the most common pattern observed in coloured animals is that also found in the European Black and White (Friesian. Holstein) with white legs. Besides this, some animals exhibit still another pattern with pigmented legs. This condition, due to a dominate gene, is illustrated with the bull Adagio and two of his sons: Kelvin de Belle Eau and Electeur de Somme.







Judging Blue Cattle



Fullblooded Bull

Most of what we accept for conformation is the same with all beef breeds. Well set legs at the four corners, not too straight or cow hocked, not set too far behind the hips. Good, strong feet not turned out or in. Strong top line, deep ribbed, clean fronted without excess leather and exhibiting a proper amount of either femininity or masculinity. Mobility is important, an animal with good flexibility and ease of movement. We want animals that can travel and stay sound out in the pastures where they work.

Here are some traits that might be different with the conformation of Blues. First, a thinner hide is desirable. They are usually lighter boned than on some breeds. This is in part due to Blues goal for higher yielding cattle. A long sloped hip with higher tail set is also acceptable. This is partially due to our extra muscling and has been argued by some to increased calving ease by opening up the calving canal. Nature seems to have selected for a sloped hip if we look at deer and elk.

The main difference is on the Blue's emphasis on muscle and yield. One of the first differences is circles. With many breeds, the terms straight, flat and square are common. Blue's muscle is always round and to add more muscle and yield we try to stack more muscle on the sides of the animal. If standing front or behind the animal, it is desirable to see circles. When looking at the hips, they should be rounded to express the extra muscle that is stacked on the sides of the hips. The ribs will also be rounded. The shoulders also should be well muscled and rounded with extra muscle stacked on the sides. The loin eye is thought to be a strong determinant of muscle, so the top should be long and thick. It can round above the backbone so that if you cup your hand and put your fingers on the backbone, the loin will fill your hand. The loin eye should stay thick all the way until it disappears between the shoulder blades. Another indication of muscle is the budging muscle at the top of the hip. When viewed from the side, the round should show good muscle definition and the muscle should fill out even the bottom of the round, a circle.

Bulls must be functional breeders. It seems that high muscle has a tendency to cause smaller testicles. So slightly smaller testicles can be expected but must still have enough size to be productive.

With many breeds judging is only visual, with Blues it should be hands on.

Raising American Blue Cattle

Recommendations from experienced breeders:

American Blue bulls for a cross breeding program we do not recommend putting them on first calf heifers. If you are using them on mature animals you will not see any calving issues that you would not see in any other breed. We have many breeders crossing the blues on multiple other breeds with no calving issues other than the obvious ie: foot back, head turned back, backwards, etc. Raising fullblood American Blue cattle tends to take a little more time and care. Below is some of the things that have been successful for experienced breeders.

- Blues need to be on a continuous very good mineral program that is high in selenium and other minerals if your area has poor nutrients.
- Young females need good nutrition (14-16% protein) for the season until they are old enough to breed for their first calf to a low birth weight breed. Some breeders breed them their first 2 calves to a low birth weight breed.
 - Breed heifers at approximately 20 24mths depending on their size.
- When heifers have bred, taper them off of feed on to grass, hay, and minerals watching body condition until they calf.
- Good body condition is very important and if you need to feed mature animals make sure they are not fed past the 4th month of pregnancy. An occasional hand full just to keep them coming up maybe. If you have extremely high protein grass it may be necessary to dry lot them and feed hay and mineral the last 3 months, again watching their condition. (Don't try and starve)
- When calves are born under stress you can give Multi-Min 90 or just selenium, and banamine, and LA 200 or Nuflur as a precaution for under developed lungs. For buckling legs give added vitamin A & D.
- When calf is born, make sure the calf gets either mother's milk or commercial colostrum with in the first couple of hours, even if you have to give it in a bottle.
- Most breeders feel it is important to feed calves as they are growing to make them reach their full potential.
- Bulls usually are not mature enough to breed until they are approximately 24 months old. American Blue animals do not mature until they are 5 years of age.
- Knowing your genetics is extremely important in full bloods and high percentage animals. Some of the old genetics can produce large calves so one must be selective for low birth weight bulls in their breeding. There is always the possibility of a genetic mix up that could produce a larger calf.
- Household sugar can be used to reduce swelling if a calf has a thick tongue.
- Get heifers or cows back on protein as soon as possible after calving to help with breed back time. Some also give cows a Multi Min 90 shot to help with vitamins and minerals.

Entry must be in juniors' name to qualify for class and overall points.
